It was bought as a family home in 1753 by Josephus Brentano, a Dutch merchant of Italian origin who decorated the house in the 18<sup>th</sup> century.

He collected many fine paintings from important masters like Rembrandt, Frans Hals and Rubens, along with Italian paintings by Titian and Raphael. Some of his paintings now adorn the Rijksmuseum.

Josephus Brentano received many distinguished guests at this place, including the Russian Emperor Alexander I, who visited Holland in 1814. King William I from the Netherlands and Prince Frederick from the Netherlands also stayed at Brentano's home.

This suite boasts a range of spaces including a dining room with an 8-seater dining table, a living room, a study, a master bathroom with a separate shower and bathtub, and a second guest bath.
